

**PCA SHAC Committee
Meeting Minutes
October 11, 2017**

Meeting was called to order at 11:40.

Meeting minutes from May 10, 2017 reviewed. Ms. Hearne's name is misspelled in minutes, otherwise minutes accepted without corrections needed.

Committee nominated and unanimously voted in Sharon Kruk as SHAC chair for the 2017-2018 school year.

Reports from Health Partners:

- Nurses' Office- Andrea True, RN
Immunization Snapshot date for this school year will be October 27, 2017. Harold Yost with the Lions Club completed automated vision screenings for PCA daycare, PK, and Kindergarten students on September 15, 2017. Vision referrals were sent home to all students that did not pass screening the last week of September. Vision screenings were completed for the following grades on the following dates: 1st and 3rd grades, October 4th; 5th graders, October 5th; and 7th graders on October 9th. The In and Out Clinic of Lufkin were on campus administering flu vaccines to staff and their families on October 6, 2017. A total of 42 injections were administered. The In and Out Clinic gives \$5 per injection back to the school. Once the \$210 is received for the given immunizations, it will be deposited into the SHAC account.
Upcoming events: Hands Only CPR will be given on October 13th and November 10, 2017. The first blood drive of the school year is scheduled for October 18th from 8AM-1PM. Hearing screenings are scheduled to be completed for all students in grades PK, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th in the month of November.
- Nutritional Services- Darcy Haden
Considering implementation of direct store module from the state.
The PTSO has provided two new microwaves for student use in the cafeterias.

- Physical Education- Antoinette Carter

All Elementary P.E. classes have approximately 44 students. All students participate in a total body warm-up which includes: running in place, jumping jacks, abdominal stretches and squats. Students have been working on basic basketball skills for the past two weeks.

Middle School P.E. classes each have approximately 60 students. Students participate in a total body warm up each day before any other physical activity which includes: running in place, jumping jacks, abdominal stretches and squats. Middle School students have a weekly schedule of events: Monday's- kickball or baseball, Tuesday's- circuit day (Hula hoops, jump rope, and 4 squares), Wednesday's- volleyball or runway, Thursday's- basketball, and Friday's- game of choice.

There are approximately 30 students in the sixth grade pre-athletics class.

There are 35-40 middle school (boy) basketball players divided into two teams (A & B).

The boys have won both tournaments they have participated in so far this season.

There are 25 middle school (girl) basketball players divided into two teams (A & B). The girls have won 1 of the 2 tournaments participated in so far this season.

There are 35 high school (boy) basketball players.

There are 20 high school (girl) basketball players.

Upcoming events: Fitness night for K-2nd students and parents is scheduled for November 14, 2017. An additional fitness night for 3-5th will be held in the Spring. Plans have been made for an afterschool running club for the elementary students. At this time, plans for the running club are on hold awaiting permission to use the retention pond behind the library.

- Counseling Office- Sonya Hearne

25 students have signed up for the Backpack Buddies program. The program can accommodate up to 30 students. Counseling offices have made hygiene products available to students in need including: deodorant, soap, lotion, tooth brushes and toothpaste. Red Ribbon Week activities kick off this Friday, October 13th. Leo the Lion will be here on Friday, October 13th for a Pep Rally with the elementary students. Ms. Hearne requested that SHAC funds pay for prizes for the top 3 winners of a Door Decorating Contest during Red Ribbon Week. The class prizes for the contest will be: 1st place- pizza party, 2nd place- ice cream party, and 3rd place- popcorn party.

Upcoming events: Relay for Life: 32 out of 129 employees have registered. Ms. Hearne opened discussion about a possible contest to promote Relay for Life participation. Ms. Hearne also shared the need for fundraising ideas for Relay for Life. Plans are being made to promote food drives for Thanksgiving and Christmas.
